ROTORUA




All teams will be based in Rotorua. We have accommodation facilities next door to the Waiariki Polytechnic where team meetings, meals and all ceremonies will take place. Accommodation at tent rate is included in the team registration package however there are options to upgrade to cabins, or a lodge.

Located in the central North Island, Rotorua is well connected to the rest of New Zealand, and the world, through a network of air and road links. The city is a leisurely three-hour drive from the gateway city of Auckland (234km), and a 5-6 -hour drive from New Zealand's capital city of Wellington (457km) at the bottom of the North Island. Transport options to Rotorua include air, coach, shuttle and self drive in rental vehicle.

Rotorua has daily AIR service links with Auckland, Wellington and Christchurch and Queenstown and twice weekly return trans-tasman flights from Sydney being on Tuesdays and Saturdays.

Although the Youth and Juniors will be accommodated and catered for in Rotorua, the township of Kawerau will be a Host City to teams with presentations taking place at Kawerau.



THE RIVERS

TARAWERA RIVER— Situated 40 minutes from Rotorua, the Tarawera River drains from lake Tarawera and falls approximately 30 minutres in the 59 km from the lake to the coast flowing through the township of Kawerau, where it forms an ideal section of grade 2-3 rapids with a small flat section in between. The short distance from the source of the river and the surround permeable soils ensure that river levels are maintained throughout the year.

Both **Youth** and **Junior** will be competing on the Tarawera for the Sprint, Head to Head and Slalom disciplines. The **Senior** and **Masters** will be competing on the Tarawera for their Slalom. The slalom section has a good mix of rapids and eddies with a gating system that allows for simple and quick gate changes. Peter Meikler believes it has the ability to create a difficult slalom course.

Parking is 20 metres away from the river and it is a very spectator friendly location with the opportunity for a real river festival atmosphere.

KAITUNA RIVER-

Located 15-20 minutes from the centre of Rotorua, the Kaituna River is the outlet of both Lake Rotorua and Rotoiti and is famous for it's waterfalls, play spots and deep green gorge. This run has been commercially rafted since 1992 and has become the most popular river run in the North Island. It's 7 metre waterfall drop has earned the badge of the highest commercially rafter waterfall drop in the world. However the waterfall is not included in either the SPRINT or HEAD TO HEAD for the Masters and Senior categories.

SPRINT—The race will start in the pool below the 7 metre Tutea Falls and finish in the pool below the bottom hole. It takes approximately 3 minutes. This section of river will test your team's technical skills as there are narrow sweeping bends, strong eddies, seven short grade 3 drops and slide style rapids. There are plenty of places to be slowed down and it will take a full team effort to keep the raft on the fastest moving water.

HEAD TO HEAD— this section of river will be from the control gates to the bottom of the Power House Weir rapid. It takes approximately 2 minutes to race and there are several opportunities to pass the opposition. It starts with a 50 metre flat section, teams then either converge or take difference currents leading into the first rapid called the Chute. Things can then change for the team depending on their accuracy as there is a tight left hand turn with a strong eddy on the inside and plenty of water pushing wide on the turn. There is then approximately 200 metres of grade 2 after which the river gorges up into narrow sweeping bends, one to the right, then one to the left leading into the Power house Weir rapid. There are then two options, take the 3 metre waterfall a few paddle strokes into the 1.5 metre weir or take the slightly faster shoot on the left that drops you straight on top of the weir. The finish

RANGITAIKI RIVER— Situated 60 minutes from Rotorua, the Rangitaiki River is a classic North Island River run with lots of technical grade 3 rapids with the added excitement of class four rapids in the first kilometer (the Masters and Senior Downriver). The run has lovely scenery, continuous rapids and its 11.5 km length is long enough to tire out the fittest paddlers.

The start has flat water wide enough for four or more teams. At the preworlds we did a monte carlo start. The race length was a good 45 minutes. The finish line is at the take out, close to where the vehicles are parked.

For the Senior and Masters the first of the rapids is at Rock A and B where NZ hosted the world cup kayak slalom in 1991. Technical grade 4 moves, followed by 200 metres of read and run before dropping into the exciting grade 4 drop of Jeff's Joy. This is a very exciting and fast piece of water. From here there is approximately 3 kms of continuous grade 2 and 3 rapids leading into a grueling flat section of water. Within this section is the start for the Youth and Junior downriver race.

Teams will slog it out, tailing each other in an attempt to make a flat water outtake. About 2 kms later the river starts dropping again and team work is crucial as there are so many rocks and rapids to remember, it seems never ending. However the river is still narrow enough to make for fast rapids, fast corners there are plenty of opportunities for rafts to overtake.

Generally used as a paddle boat with 3 thwarts, the W43 will reward your choice with predictably good performance and ease of paddling or rowing - it is very fast, easy turning, stable in extreme conditions and has good carrythrough in holes and stoppers.

One of the greatest benefits of these easy-paddling rafts is that the paddling effort required of the crew is greatly reduced. When called on in major rapids the crew

bailers, has a carefully rockered floor and smooth sandflap attachments to the sponson. The reduction in underwater drag, especially in cross-flows, gives this boat its outstanding stability and its ability to safely take lines in rapids previously not considered wise or even possible.

Whichever Whitewater model size is the appropriate choice for your river, you can expect more control, less flips and wraps, increased handling safety in marginal conditions, and a happier crew.

Sports people competing in sports events and those associated with the success of these events, such as match and tournament officials, can enter New Zealand on visitor visas, as long as their stay is for three months or less. Longer stays will require work visas. Media and broadcasters accredited to cover a sport event or tournament can enter NZ on visitor visas, as long as their stay is for three months or less. Longer stays will require work visas.

REGISTRATION AND CONTACT

The cost of team registration at time of bidding was set at NZ\$2800. This is currently being reviewed and registrations will be taken in due course.

Team registration includes for seven team members for the period of official training and competition—MEALS, ACCOMMODATION (as listed on page 6), TRANSPORTATION FROM ROTORUA AIRPORT TO ACCOMMODATION, TRANSPORATION TO AND FROM THE RIVERS AND OPENING/CLOSING CEREMONIES.

There will be opportunities for training prior to official training.
